VTA - Victorian Border Crossing Permit System 21/12/20

In reaction to the growing coronavirus issues in New South Wales the Premier of Victoria, Daniel Andrews MP, announced yesterday that there will be further restrictions governing the travel of individuals between Victoria and New South Wales.

While there has been a re-classification of the COVID Zones, (Red, Orange, Yellow, Green) the Permit System that applies to interstate truck drivers is different to the rest of the public. All interstate truck drivers will be allowed to enter Victoria without having to quarantine no matter what zone they have visited in New South Wales as long as they have a valid permit and photo identification.

You must carry a valid Victorian Border Crossing Permit together with photographic personal identification including the address where you ordinarily reside and present them to an authorised officer, a Victoria Police member or a Protective Services Officer when requested to do so.

These restrictions come into force as of 11.59pm 21st December 2020.

The current Victorian Permit system has been updated so the VTA advises that all interstate operators apply for a new 'multiday' Victorian Travel Permit if coming out of New South Wales back to Victoria. The permit site can be found on the following link. [LINK](#)
